Pioneer Graduates sought after for jobs



Monash University Malaysia (MUM) is awash with pride that its pioneer graduates have emerged with outstanding job opportunities and offers even before they graduated.

A total of 116 students received their scrolls at the graduation ceremony attended by Monash University's Vice-Chancellor and President Professor David Robinson, Chancellor Jerry Ellis, MUM's Pro Vice-Chancellor Professor Robert Bignall, Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah, Chairman of The Sunway Group, Dato' Razman M. The graduates were those in the Bachelor of Business and Commerce, Bachelor of Science (Biotechnology), Bachelor of Science (Environmental) Management, Bachelor of Computer Science who had completed three years of study at MUM and Bachelor of Nursing students were put on a two-year programme.

Graduates from MUM received the same prestigious Monash degree as their peers of over 200 who also graduated at the same University's convocation in Australia recently.

All MUM's degree programmes are selected to meet the specific needs of local and ASEAN community, based on Asian values and circumstances.



In addition, MUM first-class facilities, which meets the standards of MU, are constantly upgraded to meet the students' demands.

It is no wonder that MUM graduates in any field are highly sought after by the public and private sectors, particularly in policy-making decisions.

MUM commenced on a relatively small scale with its first intake in July 1998. The University has now a student population of 1,500 of whom 13 percent are international students.

The growing number of students seeking further education is largely attributed to the availability of opportunities in tertiary education. If closer to home, it offers the students great savings as the Monash degree is very much a coveted one.
